## The Sweetest Email I Ever Received

Recently I got a wonderful email. It is from a man who, for many years, was with the medical team in charge of the health of astronauts for NASA. Here is what he wrote to me:

"Dear Bob. You are the best. I am writing to tell you about a recent discovery I made. I logged onto one of those online ancestry services to look up my family tree and discovered that my grandfather may have been one of the first people in pioneer days to provide games...very similar to Bingo... for settlers headed to the West.

"His dad was a 'Suttler.' Not, SETTLER but SUTTLER. Let me explain. During the expansion of the West, hundreds of people drove covered wagons that were what we might call a supermarket on wheels that followed the wagon trains and sold everything from blankets to long underwear to tooth paste from a rolling Walmart on Wheels.

Last year I found my grandfather's diary. What a story it told. I found out that he loved fun and games. Although there was no Bingo back then, granddad used to gather people around his dad's wagon at night and entertain with Bingo's predecessor...BEANO.

Finally, I found my grandfather's grave in rural Montana. There, in a poorly kept graveyard, just feet from the parking lot of a McDonald's, I found it—the epitaph had been nearly obliterated by the winds and weather of time. With patience and great difficulty, I could read it: "Here lies James Forester, Age 70. Merchant's son, Husband, Father, a good man. 1870-1940."

My grandfather saw and heard the world change. He would hear the odd sounds of early airplanes barnstorming over the Prairies; the putt-putt of the first automobiles going West; voices on the new-fangled telephone...and amazing radio—never knowing that a grandson, yet born, would use that instrument to talk to astronauts on the Moon.

But, now the Suttler's son had reached the end of his journey. The rambling, lurching sales wagon of his childhood was just a memory. Life at the fort is in the dark past, though through it all, move memories of his dad...my great-grandfather.

He has found a permanent home—one marked by a crumbling gravestone on a windswept hillside in Montana. "Some may call it his 'final resting place.' But I think the Suttler's son would differ. For as long as the Montana winds stir the grasses around him...as long as a lone hawk cartwheels in the sky overhead...as long as tales of the old West are told and retold...my grandpa will never sleep. The memories of those golden days will keep him alive forever. And to those who will listen, he will continue to tell his lonely story."

## Hip Band Unveils "Bingo Live"

In anticipation of their highly anticipated annual "Goosemas" celebration, the celebrated Connecticut indie band Goose unveiled the theme for its 2024 holiday festivities, presenting "Bingo Live" to shake up its legendarily dynamic setlists even more. For their 11th annual holiday event, Goose will fly to South Carolina and assume the spotlight at North Charleston Coliseum on Dec. 13 and 14. The setlists for these two shows will be determined in real-time as an onstage host draws balls labeled with songs from their discography from a classic bingo cage roller.

# DEAR AUNT BINGO

## Follow the Bouncing Balls

Dear Aunt Bingo, I was told Bingo is programmed. I play Bingo 2 or 3 times a week. I'm beginning to think the gentleman was right. I'll explain. When Bingo is called the caller enters the numbers from the machine or paper, the caller knows if it's a valid Bingo, no matter what balls are pulled they are already programmed to machine or paper.

Sometimes I get the right machine or paper, and I get to Bingo. Please answer. DM, Minnesota

Dear DM, Well, DM, in some ways Bingo is definitely "programmed," but not in the way I think you are suggesting, which is that the outcome of each game is known in advance. Let's look in detail at some important aspects of how Bingo works.

Bingo paper usually consists of multiple cards printed on a single sheet. Serial numbers are printed on the card by the manufacturer as a sheet identifier (usually at the top of the card, centered). This is used to help prevent players from using paper from another session or another game entirely. This number is the same on every face of every book within a collated set, which simplifies tracking.

Each card also has a Card Verification Number (usually found in the free space). The unique card face number does not repeat and identifies the 24-face number configuration of the B, I, N, G, and O numbers printed on each card.

Then there is a Series Number (lower left) which identifies the cards in play in a session by the different ranges of cards. Most Bingo organizers enter all this data into computer software applications to ensure against fraud, assist in proper verification of wins and track sessions for accountability.

All this technical programming stuff aside, regardless of which cards you purchased, or their corresponding serial and verification numbers that are in the system, the Bingo balls are the random, or to your point, "unprogrammed" part of the game.

The numbers called during the game are drawn in plain sight of the players (or by a random number generator if the game is entirely electronic) THEN input into the computer (this can be done manually or through automated systems that track called numbers). Once a player calls out "Bingo!" the computer can then verify the claim by cross-checking the winning card against the randomly selected called numbers.

At the end of the day, the programmed aspects of Bingo all work to prevent fraud and decrease human error in the game of Bingo; and whether any player wins or loses comes down to the luck of the draw of the Bingo balls. Hope this helps! —Aunt Bingo

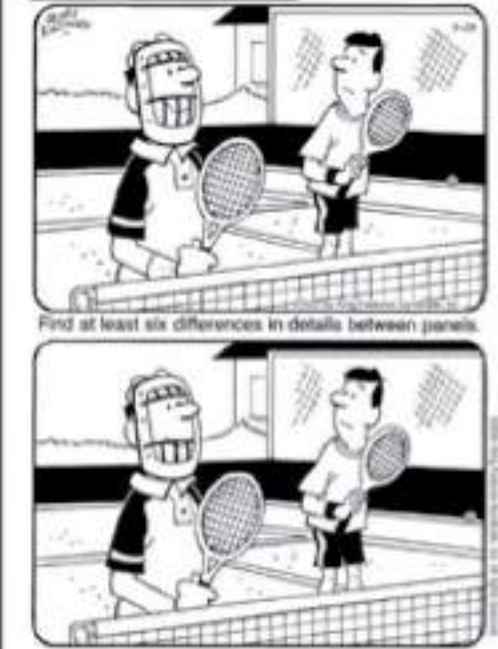

Blackjack: Fact or Fiction?

Are the following statements about blackjack facts, or are they fiction?

(1) Referring to a strategy card when you play blackjack is perfectly legal.  
(2) A blackjack player who misplays his hand will always cause other players to lose.  
(3) The third base player can influence a dealer bust by the way he plays his hand.  
(4) You should always take even money when you have a blackjack and the dealer shows an Ace.  
(5) Splitting a pair of 8s against a dealer 10 and Ace is for suckers.  
(6) A progressive betting system will overcome the house edge.  
(7) You should always hit 16 against a dealer 10.  
(8) The increase in the house edge when the casino only pays 6-5 for a blackjack is offset when only a single deck of cards is used.  
(9) A player who enters a game in the middle of a shoe will alter the flow of the cards and cause the other table players to lose.  
(10) If you see the dealer's hole card by accident and don't say anything, you are cheating.  
(11) You need to be a genius in order to be a card counter.  
(12) It doesn't matter how the casino shuffles the cards.  
(13) You are cheating if you accept a winning bet that actually lost.  
(14) If you lose five hands in a row you are due to win the next hand.  
(15) It doesn't make any difference which seat you take when you play blackjack.

**ANSWERS:**

(1) Fact. You should always have a strategy card handy in case you forget how to play a hand.  
(2) Fiction. How well or poorly your fellow players play the game does not affect your chances of winning or losing in the long run. You could have five brilliant minds, or five chimpanzees on the same table with you, and your odds of winning remain the same.  
(3) Fiction. If the actions of the third base player could influence whether a dealer busts, don't you think the casinos would be doing something about it (like putting skills on third base to play in a manner that would improve the dealer's chances of beating the table)?  
(4) Fiction. Over the long haul you will end up with more money in your pocket if you decline even money rather than taking it.  
(5) Fiction. Even though that's what was said in the movie 21, you should always split 8s against a dealer 10 and Ace.  
(6) Fiction. No betting system alone will overcome the house edge in blackjack.  
(7) Fiction. If the casino offers surrender you should surrender. If your 16 is composed of three or more cards or the result of a pair split, you should stand.  
(8) Fiction. Even the use of a single deck doesn't come close to offsetting the approximate 1.4% increase in house edge when the house pays 6-5 for a blackjack, instead of 3-2.  
(9) Fiction. Yes, the cards coming out of the shoe will be different, but you can't predict if it will be better or worse. Long term it makes no difference.  
(10) Fiction. There is nothing illegal about taking advantage of a sloppy dealer. It's the casino's responsibility to ensure that their dealers are following the correct dealing protocols.  
(11) Fiction. Casinos would like you to believe that you need to be a genius to be a card counter but that's not true. Anyone with average intelligence can learn card counting.  
(12) Fiction. If a casino is using a Continuous Shuffling Machine, the game is faster (more hands dealt per hour) and players stand to lose more per hour.  
(13) Fiction. It might be unethical to accept the winning chips, but it's not illegal. Again, the burden of responsibility rests with the casino to ensure that their dealers are paying off bets correctly.  
(14) Fiction. There has never been any mathematical study that proves your chances of winning the next hand in blackjack increases depending upon what happened in previous hands.  
(15) Fact. Your chances of winning are independent of seat position. Any seat is just as good as any other.

Casino Q&A

**Q:** How long should a slot playing session last?  
**A:** Two hours is the suggested maximum playing time without some type of break. Jabbing at buttons longer than this not only invites carpal tunnel syndrome, it wreaks havoc on your ability to think. And a frazzled mind becomes easily discouraged and leads to foolish, careless playing. Try to strike a balance between gambling and relaxing. If you do, you'll feel better and play better. And see if you don't even win more often.

**Q:** What is a nudge slot machine?  
**A:** It's a machine that moves symbols onto the payline from just above or below after the reels have stopped spinning. The most common nudge machines are IGT's Triple and Double Diamond Deluxe. When a bar symbol with a diamond on it lands just above or below the payline, that bar symbol moves (nudges) up or down to the payline. The nudge feature makes it possible for the player to have a winning spin even if no symbols land on the payline when the reels stop spinning. Other machines with this feature are Balloon Bars and Jurassic Slots.

**Q:** I hear it's best not to use a player's club card since the IRS can get a hold of the casino's records to see how much you've won or lost. Any truth to this?  
**A:** No. Casinos give information to the IRS only when you hit a jackpot of \$1,200 or more on a single slot win. The IRS is not concerned about the small wins of routine play at slot machines.

**Q:** I'm a slot hopper. I enjoy moving around and playing different slots. My wife, however, insists it's better to stick with just one slot. Who's right?  
**A:** Mathematically speaking, with today's slots it doesn't really matter which way you choose to play. Slot directors today generally order roughly the same long-term payback percentage for all of their slots in a particular denomination. So, if all slots of a given denomination pay back pretty much the same, it makes little difference whether you stick to one slot or slot hop. But slot hopping does have other advantages. By moving about, you're taking minibreaks and extending your bankroll and playing time. Playing a variety of machines also adds to your fun and enjoyment.

**Build Tasty Stuffed  
Vegetable Boats**

We've devoured farm-fresh fruits and vegetables from A-Z during these past months, but it seems like we've been stuck on the letter "Z" for quite some time -- "Z" as in zucchini. Fat ones, skinny ones, green ones, and lots of cheap ones!

For health-conscious parents, it's a challenge to get vitamin-rich zucchini and other veggies that are so abundant right now into the picky eaters in the family. Here's a strategy that is bound to please their palates. Let your kids help prepare "vegetable boats" filled with the taste of the food they love: pizza!

This yummy combination of Italian sausage, tomato sauce and cheese, when scooped into the halves and hollows of squash and peppers to resemble boats, will glide onto your kids' plates and into their tummies for a healthy fall meal.



**STUFFED VEGETABLE BOATS**  
*Serves 4-6*

- 16 ounces mild or spicy Italian sausage
- 1/2 medium onion, chopped
- 2 tablespoons green or red pepper, chopped
- 1 cup favorite prepared tomato-based pasta sauce
- 2 cups grated mozzarella cheese
- 4 medium zucchini squash, halved lengthwise (or substitute with yellow squash)
- 1 large green or red pepper
- Shredded fresh carrot and parsley for garnish (optional) pose flour
- Pinch of salt

Cook the sausage in a medium frying pan until crumbled and lightly browned. Add the onion and chopped pepper. Continue to cook for 1 minute until onions and pepper are soft. Add the sauce and 1 cup of grated cheese. Stir until heated throughout. Transfer into a bowl and set aside to cool slightly.

Let your child scoop out the insides of the squash halves with a melon baller or a small ice-cream scoop to form a cavity. They'll enjoy digging around and removing the seeds. Then make some "pepper pockets" by coring a pepper and cutting it into quarters, then in half again.

Let children spoon the sausage mixture into the cavities of the squash halves and pepper pockets. Set them on a cookie sheet or baking dish.

Bake in a 350-F oven covered loosely with foil for about 30 minutes. Remove foil and top with remaining mozzarella. Return to oven uncovered for an additional 10 minutes, until vegetables are tender.

Serve with garnishes, if you wish. Or add thin carrot sticks as ears for the little boats. Serve with garlic sticks and a fruit salad on the side.

- Extra Tips:
- Trim off a strip of squash from the curved side of the squash halves to keep the "boats" upright.
  - Onions are nothing to cry about if you leave the root end intact while cutting up the rest of the onion.

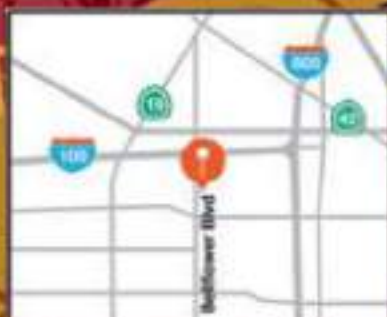

1 egg, beaten
3/4 cup heavy cream

## HOLLYWOOD by Tony Rizzo

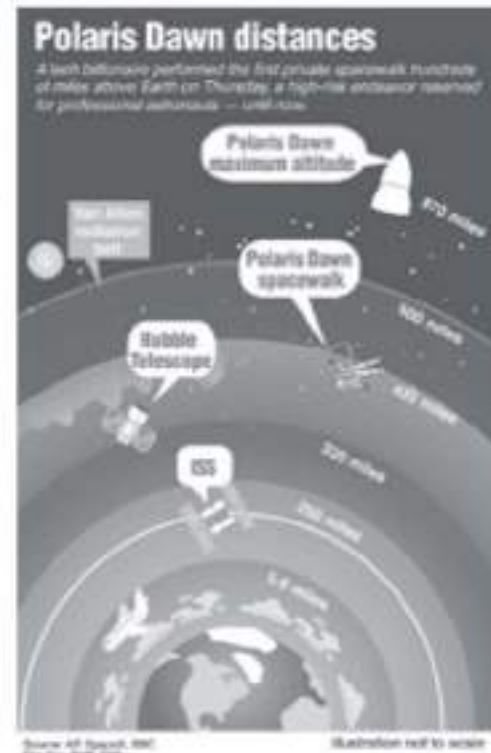
HOLLYWOOD — Ryan Reynolds amassed \$1.317 billion grosses for Deadpool & Wolverine, which landed at No. 21 on the all-time top-grossing film list, behind Star Wars: The Last Jedi at \$1.334 billion and Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows — Part 2 at \$1.342 billion.

Looking ahead, Reynolds has two new projects in his future. He'll lead the road action-comedy film Animal Friends, co-starring Jason Momoa, Vince Vaughn, Aubrey Plaza and Dan Levy (due on Aug. 15, 2025). Reynolds will also star in the action-adventure film Mayday, opposite Kenneth Branagh and Maria Bakalova, for Apple TV+.

Not quite as lucky is Kevin Costner, who ambitiously dreamed of a four-part western franchise called Horizon: An American Saga, but was disappointed by the \$36.1 million that Chapter 1 grossed against its \$50 million price tag. Chapter 2 was due in theaters in mid-August, but Warner Bros. pulled it, fearing it wouldn't do well.

Costner was then able to show Chapter 1 and Chapter 2 at the Venice Film Festival to raise awareness. The result is that Chapter 2 will soon be available on Max, the streaming platform owned by Warner Bros. Chapter 3 began filming in May and should wrap next year.

## Veterans Post

### Proving a negative?

An elderly Vietnam-era veteran is being hounded by a government agency that is insisting he pay back a loan ... a loan he never took out.

The Small Business Administration (SBA) says he took out the loan in 2021 and if he doesn't pay it back, they will take 15% of his Social Security check until it's paid for.

The veteran has tried to tell them he never applied for nor received any loan, that he hadn't owned a business (and therefore didn't qualify for a business loan), and the SBA wants him to prove it.

How do you prove a negative? It seems that the SBA would have records of where they sent that loan money, if indeed the loan was issued. But no, they're insisting the veteran prove he didn't get the loan.

Granted, there were billions of dollars handed out to fraudsters and thieves in the SBA loan program during the pandemic. But again, how do you prove a negative?

The average monthly Social Security check this year is around \$1,782. Taking away 15% leaves \$1,514. Even before deducting that 15%, it's not a lot of money, and the veteran probably doesn't have a lot to spare at the end of the month.

At this point, taking the veteran's Social Security money is on hold -- for now -- after a local investigative reporter got involved and made calls.

But a quick look on the internet shows that this veteran is only one of many this has happened to -- people being nailed for loans they never received. When they complain, all are being told to send in a long list of financial documents, such as tax returns. At first glance it looks like a scam to steal personal information.

If you're the victim of fraud such as this, deal directly with the SBA Office of Inspector General and file a complaint. As an added step, consider submitting a FOIA request for all documents related to the problem, such as the loan application itself.

## Laughlin Local Takes Home More than \$41,000 After Winning Double Progressive Jackpot at Edgewater Casino Resort

Rudy L., an "Epic" True Rewards member, scored his big win during the 11 a.m. bingo session on Thursday, Sept. 26. Before his win, the last Double Progressive jackpot hit in July when Nancy K., a "True" True Rewards member from Mandan, North Dakota, took home a staggering \$72,265 jackpot.

The flop came down AhKhJ and Foxen check-called a bet of 4 million with her middle pair and straight draw. When the 5s appeared on the turn, Serock upped his bet to 11.6 million and Foxen thought for a good bit before moving all in for 36.9 million.

Serock took off his sunglasses, picked up his cards, and then called with the AsKc for top two pair. Foxen was drawing to a ten for a straight, but the 6h river was not what she needed. Just like that, she was eliminated from the tournament in 13th place for \$600,000.

The poker community debated the hand with some arguing her all-in check-raise was a bad move while others defended its merits. According to GTO Wizard, a poker tool used to determine game-theory optimal (GTO) play, Foxen made a blunder, one that cost her approximately \$67,788 in expected value.

That said, others were quick to commend Foxen for being fearless and having the heart to attempt such a power move, one that if successful would've no doubt ensured she made the final table and put her in good

### Kristen Foxen Looks to Make History Deep in World Series of Poker Main Event

The 55th Annual World Series of Poker (WSOP) Main Event proved to be the largest in history as 10,112 players put up the \$10,000 buy-in and competed for a \$94,041,600 prize pool. Heading into Day 8, just 18 players remained and were guaranteed \$350,000 in prize money.

At the time, all eyes were on poker pro Kristen Foxen, a four-time WSOP gold bracelet winner with more than \$8.3 million in lifetime earnings according to The Hendon Mob, poker's largest live poker database. That's because she was starting the final two tables fifth in chips and looking to become just the second female in history to make the WSOP Main Event final table.

"This was the best way to get him out of my basement," he joked. As for Andrews, he planned to use the money exactly as his father intended, telling lottery officials that he's excited to buy a home for himself and his new wife.

"I had no idea I was the winner," medical receptionist Carr said. "If it weren't for the billion-dollar Powerball winner making news, I would have forgot." The winning ticket had been drawn on March 15, over a month before Carr realized she had it. She plans to pay off her and her husband's mortgage with the winnings, calling it "a dream come true." She also wants to buy a new truck and book a trip to Hawaii.

#### Second Chance for a Win

An unsuspecting Michigan man who won more than \$400,000 in a lottery drawing thought it was a joke when he found out he hit the jackpot. "I play games online a lot, but I had no idea I was earning entries into a second chance giveaway when playing certain games," the 67-year-old man, who asked to remain anonymous, told Michigan Lottery officials. "I saw an email from the Michigan Lottery saying I'd won a \$416,322 second chance prize and I figured it was a scam email since I didn't enter a giveaway." But the Kalamazoo County man really was the winner of the BIG CASH Second Chance game following the Oct. 11 random drawing, according to the Michigan Lottery.

#### Found Ticket, New Truck

A Nebraska man won an \$81,000 Ford truck months after he tossed aside the winning \$2 scratch-off lottery ticket. "I was cleaning out my glove box," Lucas Swarhout told Nebraska lottery officials. The name comes from the Four Sixes Ranch, which covers 266,000 acres over three counties in west Texas; it was purchased from the family that founded it and owned it for 120 years by Sheridan and investors in 2020 for upwards of \$350 million. The pop-up is in Tableau, the Wynn's breakfast-brunch restaurant, which now serves dinner at the steakhouse 5:30-10 p.m. The online menu on the Wynn's website doesn't list prices, though it does give it SSSS. The beef is mostly the 6666 Angus brand; strip, skirt, and filets of nine to 16 ounces, along with an 18-oz. ribeye, 26-oz. Cowboy, 40-oz. porterhouse, and 48-oz. Tomahawk.

**The Garden Bug**

Soil with a pH level above 7 is alkaline, and less than 7 is acidic (7 is "neutral"). Plants that like acidic soil include azaleas, rhododendrons, hydrangea, gardenias, camellias, holly shrubs, crepe myrtles, calla lilies and pine trees.

To increase the acidity of your soil, mix ground **Acidic soil** rock sulphur into it, using 1.2 oz. per square yard for sandy soils and 3.6 oz. per square yard for all other soils. You can also add sawdust, composted leaves and peat moss to lower the soil pH. - Brenda Weaver
